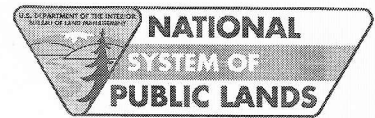

COMMENTS:

Item 1: I strongly oppose routing the Sunzia lines anywhere in the Middle San Pedro Valley, except for the area along the I10 corridor. My opposition is based on environmental reasons, as stated elsewhere by Cascabel Working Group.

Item 2: I am profoundly disturbed by the damage that would be caused to landscape by the proposed routes. For example, route segment C 276 would deface a set of cliffs/badlands with towers and a road; the cliffs are the central scenic focus of Cascabel, and a spiritual focus for the local community. Similarly, Hot Springs Canyon is a scenic/spiritual focus area that would be marred by route segments C321, 331. Defacing the Cascabel landscape in this manner is absolutely unacceptable.
